


WADOWICE





Wadowice is situated between the elevations of Wielickie Foothills and Beskid Mały mountain chains, in a picturesque valley of the Skawa river, at the height of about 270 m above sea level. The town is located on different levels, the lowest part are the valley of Skawa river and Choczenka and Dąbrówka streams, the highest points are Czumówka, Łazówka and the Municipal Park with Adam Mickiewicz mound. The town has 19.5 thousand inhabitants and the entire commune has almost 38 thousand inhabitants.

Wadowice plays an important role in this part of the region, it is the centre of local and regional initiatives, administrative, cultural and educational centre, the seat of commune and county authorities.

Two important transport routes of national importance cross the area of the commune, they intersect in Wadowice, Kraków – Bielsko-Biała route and the road connecting Silesia with Podhale and Zakopane. It is 50 km to Kraków, the capital of Małopolska from here.

The history of Wadowice goes back to the $13^{\rm th}$ century. The town was first mentioned in 1327 and it obtained municipal rights in 1430. It was made famous by its theologian and philosopher Marcin Wadowita, professor and dean of the Cracow Academy, who founded the hospital for the poor in the $17^{\rm th}$ century and supported the local parish school.

The town developed well when the Austrian authorities constructed the road connecting Vienna with Lviv. Wadowice was situated on an important transport route. The seat of the circuit authority (large administrative unit) and then a county was moved here. Barracks, court, hospital and numerous offices were also located here. Cultural, social and patriotic organizations and associations were active in Wadowice.

After recovering independence in 1918 Wadowice remained a county town and was an important administrative and cultural centre. In 1918, the 12th infantry regiment was created

and became renowned for its heroic fights with the Bolsheviks in the years 1919 – 1920 and during the September campaign in 1939. The regiment played an important role in the town life during the period between the World Wars.

During the Nazi occupation Wadowice was included in the German Reich. The German extermination policy resulted in almost entire (2 thousand men, women and children) Jewish population of the town being wiped off in death camps. After the end of the Second World War, difficult years of recovery and totalitarian rule of the left-wing politicians came.

When communism was abolished Wadowice entered the period of constitutional changes and dynamic development. For over 20 years it has been the seat of active communal self-government and since 1999, also the centre of the county. The importance of the town grows systematically and it takes advantage of its historical opportunities more and more. Currently, Wadowice is a strong municipal centre with an unquestioned position, offering jobs in trade, services, food industry and crafts. According to the Mayor of Wadowice, Ewa Filipiak, the most valuable asset of the Town are its inhabitants who are renowned for their hard working and economical attitude.

The home town of John Paul II is very attractive to tourist and pilgrims. The Family Home Museum of John Paul II is visited by thousands of people. Popular tourist routes to Laskowiec, very often mentioned by John Paul II, and to other nice places in Beskid Maly, start here.

The travellers and inhabitants can stay at many restaurants, cafes and confectioneries, where they can taste the world famous Wadowice cream cakes.

Wadowice inhabitants are proud of their town character and its connection to John Paul II. Papal references can be encountered everywhere. They are expressed in street and square names, and specific initiatives resulting from the teaching of our great compatriot.

KAROL WOJTYŁA ROUTE



Karol Wojtyła Route in Wadowice was already set out in 2005 and joins 11 places connected with the childhood and youth of Karol Wojtyła, currently Blessed John Paul II. Individual places on the route are marked by boards with archive photos of the buildings and historical descriptions in three languages – Polish, English and Italian.

Karol Wojtyła was born in this house on $18^{\rm th}$ May 1920. He spent his childhood and youth here. During the years 1919-1938 the Wojtyła family occupied two rooms and a kitchen on the first floor. Since 1984 the Family Home Museum of John Paul II has been located here. Currently, the museum is under renovation which should finished by spring 2013. During the renovation time, the exhibits from the Family Home are presented at the specially prepared exhibition "The treasure of my life" at the Catholic House near the Basilica.

The parish church is a special place for John Paul II, this is where he was baptised, received his First Holy Communion, was confirmed and said his first mass. He came here as a Pope during his three visits to Wadowice - in 1979, 1991, 1999. In 1992 John Paul II upgraded the status of the Church of the Presentation at the Temple to Minor Basilica. There are four chapels in the basilica: St Cross Chapel with Wadowice painting of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, crowned by the Pope during his last visit in Wadowice, Sacred Family Chapel with the Sacred Family figures and the baptismal font where Karol Józef Wojtyła was baptised on 20th June 1920, placed centrally, Crucifixion Chapel with the relics of St Father Pio, Szymon of Lipnica and Maximilian Kolbe placed in the tabernacle, Blessed Holy Father John Paul II Chapel with a reliquary containing his blood, placed on the altar and with the chapel patron painting above. The figure of Blessed John Paul II and the sceptre of Pope Benedict XVI are placed in the chapel as the souvenir of the Pope's pilgrimage to Wadowice in 2006.





One of the oldest buildings in the town, constructed in the years 1800 – 1820. At the time when Karol Wojtyła lived here, the building housed a dairy shop and a canteen run by Zofia Banaś. It was here, after the death of his mother Emilia, that Karol Wojtyła would eat along with his father. The building is occupied by the Town Museum and Tourist Information Centre (MSIT).

Currently, the museum offers a multimedia exhibition 'Wadowice of Karol Wojtyła', which shows the town during the period of childhood and youth of later Pope John Paul II.

The museum office offers guiding services in Wadowice and Kalwaria Zebrzydowska.



The municipal office building was created in 1846 and was the seat of municipal and country authorities, circuit and common school, and since 1975 it has been the seat of the municipal and communal authorities. During the period between the World Wars it housed a common school and municipal office. Karol Wojtyła attended the school during the years 1926 – 1930.






The beginnings of the present Secondary School named after Marcin Wadowita go back to 1866. The statute of Emil Zegadłowicz is located in front of the building and a quotation from Roman poet Albius Tibullus: (translated from Latin) "The Highest One likes what is pure, come in pure garments and take water from the source with pure hands" is placed over the entrance.

Many renowned graduates came from Wadowice grammar school: General Walerian Czuma – commander of Warsaw defence in 1939, Saint Józef Bilczewski – Metropolitan Cardinal of Lviv. Karol Wojtyła attended this grammar school in the years 1930-1938. He was an exceptional student, he obtained only very good marks for eight years. He became the class head already in the $2^{\rm nd}$ grade. He joined the Marian Solidation which he chaired for two years and participated in the works of "Sokół".

When we attended the 5th grade of grammar school, we staged Sophocles Antigone. Antigone – Halina, Ismene – Kazia, my God, I played Haemon. "My beloved sister, Ismene, can't you see that we are not spared from any Oedipus' calamities?" I can still remember this.

The Monastery of the Barefoot Carmelites - St Joseph Sanctuary

The Carmelites came to Wadowice in 1892. The present monastery "On the hill" was constructed in the years 1897 – 1899 and includes the monastery complex with a pilgrims house and St Joseph Sanctuary. The monastery was built by Saint Rafał Kalinowski who was the abbot of Wadowice congregation several times. St Joseph Church is a Neo-Roman building with three



aisles. The main altar with St Joseph painting made in Tirol was places in a small presbytery. The cell of Saint Rafał is open to visitors and it contains his memorabilia.

Some persons who were sanctified and who are candidates for saints are connected with the monastery: Saint Rafał



Kalinowski, Blessed Alfons Maria Mazurek, Servant of God Kunegunda Siwiec, Servant of God Anzelm Gadek, Servant of God Rudolf Warzecha. After the First Holy Communion Karol Wojtyła received a scapular here and it returned to Wadowice Carmel in November 2005, following the wish of John Paul II. It is placed in a special reliquary near the altar with Blessed Alfons Mazurek relics, In 2004 Holy Father John Paul II gave his ring to St Joseph. This ring was fixed on the finger of St Joseph and can be seen in the painting of the main altar, at the same time, the church was upgraded to the status of the Sanctuary.

 Novena service is combined with the evening mass.

You can come to the monastery gate every day to:

- confess,
- receive the Carmelite scapular,
- visit the place in a group with a guide,
- · visit the cell where Saint Rafał Kalinowski lived and worked,
- order holy mass for specific dates, indefinite dates, Gregorian mass and perpetual mass.





Blessed John Paul II



The Nazareth Sisters came to Wadowice in 1896. They started from running a kindergarten and after the construction of the building started in 1905, they opened a tailor school for girls. When the school was closed in 1956, they started taking care of the disabled children.







The church was constructed as the votive offering of gratitude for the election of Karol Wojtyła to the See of St Peter and for saving the life of the Holy Father after the assassination on $13^{\rm th}\,{\rm May}$ 1981 in St Peter's Square. The project combines the elements of Baroque style and the architecture of St Peter's Basilica, its design resembles Roman triumphal arches. The construction started in 1984 and the church was consecrated on $14^{\rm th}\,{\rm August}$ 1991 by Pope John Paul II.

The statute of John Paul II by an Italian artist Luciano Minguzzi is standing in front of the church. There is also a chapel consecrated by Cardinal Franciszek Macharski in 1986. The belfry with three bells called John Paul I, John Paul II and St Peter, the gift of the home town of John Paul I, Vittorio Veneto, is located on the other side.


Inside the church, the main altar with the copy of Perugino's fresco from the Sistine Chapel occupies the central place. Two lines of red marble flow from the altar, forming the shape of St Peter's Square in Vatican. The red lines symbolize "streaks of blood" lost by John Paul II after the assassination. The plaque with the date of 13th May 1981 was fixed in the proper place. Two side altars can be found in the church: the Divine Mercy and especially revered altar of Our Lady of Fatima. Stain glasses referring to Fatima revelations are placed in the windows. Golgotha has been arranged on a small hill behind the church.



The present building contains the structure of the former "Sokół" Gymnastic Association which was created in 1889. The association was one of the most important patriotic organizations in Wadowice and conducted extensive cultural activities and sport sections: gymnastics, skating, riflery and fencing. As a student of the Common School and Grammar School, Karol Wojtyła participated in many theatre plays, morning cultural activities, municipal and patriotic celebrations and physical training classes. Currently, the building houses Wadowice Cultural Centre and one of its parts is "Centrum" cinema where first screenings of the documentaries and films about John Paul II took place.

The confectionery of Karol Hagenhuber from Vienna was one of the most elegant cafes in the town, often frequented by the intelligentsia and officers of the 12th infantry regiment stationed in Wadowice. It was here that consecutive graduates of Wadowice Grammar School organized a competition after school-leaving exams, they bet who would eat the largest number of cream cakes. The confectionery was closed in 1945 and the cream cakes mentioned by the Holy Father can be found in all Wadowice confectioneries.


Blessed John Paul II



The largest building in the town and the only military construction landmark of its kind in Poland. Typical for former Austrian barrack constructions, it was created in 1827 for Austrian battalions of the 56th infantry regiment which were stationed in Wadowice since 1820 and consisted of the local inhabitants from Wadowice and its neighbourhood. Since 1918 the 12th infantry regiment of Wadowice Land was stationed here. Karol Wojtyła, the senior, father of John Paul II, served in the 56th regiment of Austrian army and then in the 12th infantry regiment in the years 1900 -- 1928. Small Karol participated

in the patriotic celebrations and events organized for children from military families.

SACRAL BUILDINGS in the neighbourhood of Wadowice



The Pallottine Priests settled in Kopiec in 1909 and established their Collegium Marianum here. Currently, it is used as the novitiate for young men. The tourists can visit the exhibition which shows pilgrimages of John Paul II and papal gifts coming from the entire world. Blessed Józef Jankowski and Blessed Józef Stanek are connected with the monastery.



The Sanctuary in Kalwaria Zebrzydowska was created at the beginning of the 17th century as the foundation of Mikołaj Zebrzydowski. Crowds of pilgrims gather here especially for the Glorious Mystery of the Lord during the Holy Week and the Burial and Triumph of Our Lady in August. The Sanctuary in Klawaria consists of the Baroque basilica with the miraculous painting of Our Lady of Calvary, the monastery and a complex of Baroque and Mannerist chapels and churches which merge with the picturesque Beskidy landscape, referred to as the Calvary paths. The Sanctuary was constructed to resemble the Way of the Cross in Jerusalem. Kalwaria Zebrzydowska was included on UNESCO World Cultural and Natural Heritage List, as a heritage architectural, landscape and pilgrimage complex, Basilica, Bernardine Monastery and paths in 1999.



The Chapel of Our Lady, Queen of the Mountains was created in 1995 as a gift from tourists to Holy Father John Paul II. The Peak of John Paul II (890 m above sea level) is the only mountain top in Poland which bears the name of the Polish Pope. Karol Wojtyła participated in school trips to the peak (then called Jaworzyna) and nearby Leskowiec, as a student. Last time he climbed Leskowiec as a cardinal in 1970, after the mass celebrated on the 25th anniversary of his priesthood in Kalwaria Zebrzydowska. The statute of Pope John Paul II is standing next to the chapel. Holy masses are organized at the Peak of John Paul II on different occasions.




• 18th century St Erasmus Church in Barwald Dolny,
The church was built in the second half of the 18th century,
apart from the tower which remained after the previous
church dating back to the 16th century. Its untypical and
rarely encountered layout is worth noticing, the tower
is located east of the presbytery and not west of the aisle.
A rood beam with a Late Gothic crucifix, stone Baroque
baptismal font and Rococo organ from 1770 should
also be noted.



- St Martin Church in Marcyporeba dating back to 1670 with its most precious heritage objects: Gothic crucifix, stone Renaissance baptismal font and Late Baroque organ. The painting of the Assumption of Our Lady from the 17th century is located in the main altar.
- St Simon and Jude Church in Nidek dating back to 1539.
 The oldest church furnishing is a baptismal font from the 16th century. The church is surrounded by low external arcades supported by pillars. Currently, the church is not used.
- The Church of Transfiguration in Radocza dating back to 1535. Three Baroque altars, organ prospectus from the 18th century, stain glass from the 20th century and chandeliers from the 19th/20th century have survived from the former furnishings. A Baroque painting of the Transfiguration of the Lord is located in the main altar.
- Church of the Assumption of Our Lady in Woźniki
 dating back to the 16th century with its oldest preserved element, Gothic crucifix, the remaining furnishings come from the 16th and 18th century.
- St Joachim Church in Skawinki dating back to the 17th
 century. Baroque church with modern furnishings, except
 for the painting of the Sacred Family which remained from
 the former furnishings.
- Our Lady Church in Sosnowice dating back the 16th century. Classicist main altar with a Baroque painting of Our Lady with Infant Jesus.







Papal routes usually follow the traditional tourist routes of Polish Tourist and Landscape Association which were already used during the times of Cardinal Karol Wojtyła. They are additionally marked by information boards or signposts fixed in more important places.


